## Book of Acts 10-12 LeRoy Eims

- I. Introduction.
- II. Angels are not allowed to give the message of God this is reserved solely for us.
  - A. The gospel of God has been committed to us. (1 Thessalonians 2:7)
  - B. God's only access to the hearts of men is the bridge of the gospel.
  - C. This priceless treasure has been committed to us.
- III. Peter continues to give himself to prayer where God leads him to preach to the Gentiles. This is a mystery that has been kept secret since the world began. (Romans 16:25, Colossians 3:11, Revelation 7:9, Colossians 1:25-29, Ephesians 3:3)
- IV. The men in the book of Acts would rather be vilified than deified. (Isaiah 42:8, Acts 14:14, Acts 3)
  - A. God is no respecter of persons. However at the time of Jesus the Pharisees thought otherwise thanking God that he was not a Gentile, a slave or a woman.
  - B. Jesus treated people like people and they were not used to that.
- V. Miracles were used for validation among the Jews showing that the Gentiles were brought into the God's family. (Acts 1:8, Acts 8, Acts 10)
- VI. Laymen were the ones out sharing the word and preaching the Lord Jesus.
  - A. The exhortation to new Christians was to cling close to Jesus.
  - B. They believed, turned and followed, and clung closely to Jesus as they followed Him.
  - C. The name "Christian" was born at Antioch out of a group of laymen.
- VII. The believers shared their goods among themselves. (Proverbs 3:27)
  - A. People do not give as they should because of extravagance, covetousness, and ignorance.
  - B. When there was a need the believers sent the best that they had mutually.
- VIII. They prayed a "stretching" prayer for Peter.
  - A. It is not humanly impossible to escape with sixteen guards.
  - B. Peter was known for wandering demonstrating further the need for this prayer.
  - C. Herod, his threat, was ultimately eaten by worms.

2. Can angels preach the gospel? How is this an illustration of God's desire to use all people?
