- I. Introduction.
- II. Sadducees were the primary threat in Acts because they were opposed to the resurrection of the dead.
 - A. They wanted to bring the death sentence to Peter for his act of healing because any person doing a deed by a magical authority was to be stoned in Biblical times. Peter responded by citing Scripture as Jesus had taught him. (Matthew 21)
 - B. If you want your followers to be a certain way, you must lead by example.
- III. There is no other name for salvation besides Jesus Christ. (Acts 4:12)
 - A. Other religions point out our needs and tell us what to be; Jesus meets our needs and makes us what we need to be.
 - B. The disciples were bold in their witness.
 - 1. They prayed for it. (Acts 4:29, Philippians 1:14)
 - 2. They lived in victory. (Proverbs 28:1, Jeremiah 20:9)
 - 3. They were knit in unity and sacrifice. God blesses us when we give our lives.
 - C. The disciples were in one accord this is the expression of love in Acts. The Body of Christ is to function together with all its different gifts.
- IV. God laid down conditions to be a part of the community, but Ananias and Saphira tried to get in deceitfully.
- V. The Apostles made the commitment that they must obey God rather than man. (Acts 5:29)
