- II. A disciple is a learner.
 - A. "Yes but" evidences a non-learner. (Matthew 11:29, John 13:13)
 - B. Jesus teaches us primarily through His Word—we must be in the Word of God to learn of Jesus. (II Timothy 3:16)
 - 1. There are certain things we need to stop doing as a Christian.
 - 2. There are certain things we are to do so that we can do better.
 - 3. The Scriptures are the comprehensive equipment for the man of God.
 - 4. All Scripture is given by God. (Psalm 119:11)
 - C. The Bible has always been attacked throughout history. (Genesis 3)
 - 1. There is no way that anyone can touch the Word of God—its copyright is in heaven.
 - 2. God's Word cannot be amended.
 - 3. We are called upon to place our faith in the Word of God. (Palm 119:19)
 - 4. The Word of God is our life's road map. (Psalm 119:30)
- III. A disciple is a follower. (John 12:24-26, Matthew 4:19)
 - A. A follower is a witness.
 - 1. The Lord accomplishes a witness. (Acts 2:41-42, II Samuel 23:10, I Chronicles 11:12-14)
 - 2. God uses people to accomplish it. (Acts 10, Romans 15:18)
 - a. He cannot use an angel to accomplish the method of redemption.
 - b. The witness's concern is primarily with his vertical relationship with God.
 - B. Do not become so busy in the work of the kingdom that you do not have time for the King because that is what makes you effective.
