I. Introduction.

- A. Jesus Christ was born to die for our sins. (Mark 9)
- B. Peter was guilty of blasphemy placing Jesus alongside Moses and Elijah—Jesus is light years beyond any other religious person because He died for our sins.
- C. Jesus is the author of anything spiritual. (II Corinthians 5:17)
- D. Christ is at the center of the obedient Christian life.
- II. The Christian life.
 - A. Christ is the center.
 - B. Prayer, obedience, the Word and fellowship are the hands reaching out.
- III. By every criterion there is we belong to God—by design, by creation, by indwelling. (I Corinthians 6:19-20, Genesis 1:21, Psalm 100:3)
 - A. We must not presume to use for ourselves that which belongs to God.
 - B. We must say goodbye to self.
 - C. Honor God with whatever you have because we belong to the Lord. (Proverbs 3:9-10)
- IV. High fidelity is a mark of following the Lord. (Luke 9:23, Revelation 14:4)
 - A. Fidelity means to go in the direction God wants us to go in.
 - B. Our lives must be available to Him to use.
- V. All of life is a tradeoff. (John 3:30)
 - A. If you want more of one thing, you have to take less of something else.
 - B. We must abstain from certain things so that Christ can increase.
 - C. We must follow the voice of the Good Shepherd. (John 10:4-5)
