 - A. We are afraid.
 - 1. We fear the unknown. But we can trust the Shepherd. (Isaiah 41:10; 50:10)
 - 2. We fear the slippery places. The promises of God get us across. (Psalm 73; Habakkuk 3:19)
 - 3. We fear the enemy. The Shepherd enables us to hold our ground when we compare the enemy to God. (2 Timothy 1:7; James 4:7; 2 Chronicles 20)
 - B. We are given to detours. (Hebrews 3:10)
 - C. We are restless and think the grass is greener on the other side of the fence. We all have a place in the body of Christ. (1 Corinthians 12)
 - D. We are wayward. The Shepherd gets us back on our way. (Isaiah 53; Job 5:15-19)
 - E. We are adventuresome, but we like lower ground when we get older. We should pray for the higher ground.
 - F. We keep together to protect ourselves. We need to check which flock we are following to keep us from the enemy. (Ecclesiastes 4:9-10)
 - G. We need leaders, so we need the Shepherd. (John 10:3; Psalm 23; Psalm 78)
 - H. We express defiance.
 - I. The Shepherd knows our name. (John 10:3-4; Jeremiah 31:3)
 - J. We are in danger of being undernourished. We must be sheered to remain healthy.
