- II. Why MacArthur wrote *Answering Tough Questions about Salvation*. The charismatic church and the psychological salvation movement have created an illusion of salvation in the culture. (Matthew 7:21-23)
- III. Why the issue of "easy believism" is such an issue.
 - A. This kind of gospel is being preached.
 - B. We are quickly producing a gospel without contents.
 - C. Read Charles Finney on this.
 - D. If we are not careful, we will appeal to people's emotions instead of a clear presentation of the truth.
- IV. What a person needs to believe to be saved.
 - A. We need to know that Jesus is God in human flesh that came to die on the cross and rise again for our sins.
 - B. One must believe in Jesus, which is more than intellectual.
 - C. Components of saving faith.
 - 1. It forsakes all human means of salvation. (Acts 9, Philippians 3, Matthew 16)
 - 2. It involves turning from sin.
 - 3. It is a commitment.
 - D. The nature of conversion involves change.
- V. If salvation is by faith alone, why is there so much emphasis on discipleship?
 - A. Only God can save a person. No human work saves a person.
 - B. However, if God had never jerked a person out of his sin, he would never be saved.
- VII. Repentance, faith, belief and discipleship.

- A. Repentance, faith and belief are a package resulting in discipleship.
- B. Whatever the Lord does is complete. At the heart of every Christian is a person who loves God. (John 4)
- VIII. What discipleship is: It is the process of learning what Jesus wants a person to know.
- IX. How man can make an exchange if salvation is by grace. Jesus said to exchange all of you for all of your soul. (Matthew 16:29, Philippians 3:3)
- X. Whether one can be saved without knowledge of Christ's Lordship. No, but children can be saved without realizing the full implications of Christ's Lordship.
- XI. How we can be sure of our salvation. If true salvation has occurred, a believer will continue in the Word of God. (John 8:31-32)
