- I. Introduction. Text: Luke 1:26.
- II. What is not meant by the Virgin Birth.
 - A. He was not born different from other boys.
 - B. This was not the result of a miracle of advanced years. (Luke 1:7)
 - C. This was not the result of physical contact. (Matthew 1)
 - D. Jesus was miraculously conceived but naturally born.
- III. The Virgin Birth is an indisputable fact.
 - A. It was prophesied that Jesus would be born of a virgin. (Genesis 3:14-15, Isaiah 7:14, Matthew 1)
 - B. Jesus was born of Mary and not of Joseph. (Luke 1, Matthew 1)
 - C. The virgin birth is possible because it comes from the Sovereign God. (Luke 3:23)
 - D. Mark and John did not include the Virgin Birth because they were writing for different reasons.
 - E. If one rejects some portions of the Gospels, he has no basis for upholding the rest of them.
 - F. Doubt has a domino effect. (Psalm 23)
 - G. If Mary was not a virgin, she gave birth illegitimately and could not have been considered highly favored among men.
 - H. A major problem is unbelief in the miracles.
- IV. Understanding the Virgin Birth.
 - A. The deity of Christ did not begin at the Virgin Birth.
 - B. Jesus Christ who was fully God was growing into His humanity. He was and always shall be God.
 - C. The Incarnation is the event where Jesus as God assumed human nature but remained sinless. (Genesis 1:2)
 - D. Jesus came to bring deity and humanity together so that we could identify with God. (Philippians 2)

- E. Jesus had to be sinless in order to satisfy the sin debt of mankind.
- F. Without the Virgin Birth all that is taught about Jesus does not add up.
- G. If we do not accept this truth, we will be forever separated from God.
