- I. Introduction.
  - A. Text: Judges 7:1-7.
  - B. There are truths we can practice when the odds are against us.
- II. God will use our difficulties to build our faith.
  - A. Fleece throwing is not a means by which we should determine the will of God.
  - B. God's preparation for Gideon's ministry began by building his faith.
  - C. God demonstrates His awesome power, and we learn to trust Him.
- III. God will often require us to do those things that seem unreasonable.
  - A. This is where we often fall to defeat.
  - B. Gideon appeared outnumbered.
  - C. God was the one who would do the Israelite's warfare. God's first test was a test of fear. (Deuteronomy 20:3, 8)
  - D. Some men were not committed to winning the battle because they took their eyes off the enemy.
- IV. God will lead us to do what will bring Him the most glory.
  - A. God gets more glory when we are weaker.
  - B. The more successful you are, the greater danger your failure and the more sensitive you are to egoism based on the past.
- V. God usually strips us of all dependence upon ourselves.
  - A. God stripped the armies of Gideon of basic weaponry.
  - B. God only wants us to trust in Him.
  - C. The only way one can be victorious is God.
  - D. God releases His power to the degree that one is dependent upon Him.
- VI. God will send us encouragement when we grow faint-hearted.
  - A. God is sensitive toward the weak hearted.

- B. God encouraged Gideon by affirming that Mideon had been given to him.
- C. God understands our failures and is there to walk us through it.
- VII. God always works in the other camp on our behalf.
- VIII. God will give us specific instruction resulting in victory if we obey Him.
  - A. God's way is always victorious.
  - B. The key to victory is obedience. Disobedience short-circuits the sovereign power of God.
  - C. A person does not have anything until he has God.
