I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Acts 13.
- B. Our responsibility is to warn every man and to teach every man.

- D. The only way one can be justified is by the grace of God.
- E. The gospel presents an interesting crisis.

II. Alternatives: If one is not justified, he is judged.

III. Responses: Some of the people were filled with jealousy and others with joy.

IV. Some reject the message of justification by faith and others are ordained to eternal life.

V. Principle: the rejection of the message led to the rejection of the listeners.
