- B. Moses prayed for the people when they fell into idolatry.
- II. He prayed for pardon for the people's sin. He prayed for pardon based on God's reputation among the nations.
- III. He prayed for the presence of the Lord. (Exodus 33:13)
 - A. We ought to feel like Moses—we should not want to go anywhere without God's presence.
 - B. God's presence distinguishes us.

 - A. He revealed His attributes. (Psalm 19:1)

 - C. All afflictions are light in comparison to the glory of God that we will receive from Him.
- VI. We have advantages concerning the glory of God that Moses did not have. (II Corinthians 3)
 - A. We have greater opportunity.
 - B. We all are welcome into the Holy of Holies.
 - 1. We are not satisfied until God shows us His glory.
 - 2. All other needs are small when one knows God.
