 - 2. God will never leave a believer. (Hebrews)
 - 3. God knows better than we do.
- V. What we have to learn.
 - 1. The silence of God should never be misinterpreted as the indifference of God. God cares.

3. Even in God's silence, He can still be heard. (Luke 7)
