- I. Introduction.
 - A. The mark of a spiritual man is discernment.
 - B. We are left to discern when the Word of God does not directly address an issue.
 - C. There are principles for discerning in doubtful things.
- II. We must decide whether it is a weight. (Hebrews 12:1)
 - A. We should be more concerned with what is right about something and not what is wrong about it.
 - B. We should look to what is beneficial to avoid burdens.
- III. We must decide whether the thing controls us. (I Corinthians 6:12)
 - A. Giving control to anything is sin.
 - B. We must avoid the habit.
- IV. We must be certain that it is good without doing damage to our consciences. (Romans 14:23)
 - A. Christians had conscience issues over eating in the past.
 - B. If one acts in doubt, he shows that he does not care about his relationship with God.
 - C. One sins if he has doubts in his mind.
- V. We must ask if it causes a brother to stumble. (I Corinthians 8:13)
 - A. Whatever is not faith is sin—if we do something that puts someone else in doubt, we too sin.
 - B. We must not harm our brother.
- VI. We must ask if it will influence an unsaved person towards Christ. (Colossians 4:1)
 - A. We have to ask who is influencing whom in a relationship with an unbeliever.
 - B. We should maintain relationships with unbelievers so long as we are influencing them and they are not influencing us.
- VII. We must obey parents if it is questionable. (Ephesians 6:1)
- VIII. We must ask if it will bring glory to God. To bring glory to God means to show what God is like. (I Corinthians 10:31)

IX. Obeying these principles makes us slaves to others although we are free. We should submit ourselve
one to another—this is where true Christian liberty is found. (I Corinthians 9:19)
