II. Soldiers.

A. They scourged Him.

B. They put on Him a scarlet robe and crown of thorns mocking His royalty. (Genesis 3, Galatians 3)

III. The people.

- A. The people guarded Him. (John 19:34)
- B. The Romans pull out Simon to help Jesus carry the cross.
- C. Simon likely became a believer after this experience.
- D. The soldiers cast lots for Jesus' clothes. (Psalm 22)
- IV. The religious leaders. The religious leaders mocked Jesus telling Him to come down from the cross.
- V. The robbers. Thieves were crucified alongside Christ.
- VI. The purpose of Jesus' humiliation.
 - A. It is the fulfillment of prophesy.

B. Jesus' humiliation is a model for us—we are not to revile when we are humiliated. (I Peter 2, Philippians 2)

- C. Jesus' humiliation demonstrates the result of sin.
- D. The cross was the hinge of history-it marks whether a person is with Christ or against Him.
