- II. Bad things happen to God's people to determine whether their faith is a lasting faith. (II Chronicles 33:31)
- III. Bad things happen to God's people to wean them from the world. (John 6:6, Hebrews 11)
- IV. Bad things happen to God's people to call them to a heavenly hope of the glories to come. (Romans 5, Hebrews 12, II Corinthians 1)
- V. Bad things happen to God's people to show them what they really love.
- VI. Bad things happen to God's people to teach us obedience. (Hebrews 12:11)
- VII. Bad things happen to God's people to show them His goodness.
- VIII. Bad things happen to God's people to develop their spiritual strength.
- IX. Bad things happen to God's people to enable them to help others in trial. (Luke 22:21)
- X. Bad things happen to God's people to display His astounding power.

 - B. This happens when the persecution is for Christ's sake.
 - C. God may bring a believer to his limits--to the place where he has no power--in order to glorify Himself.
