A. The false teachers were relying on letters of recommendation. (Nehemiah 2:7, Acts 9, Romans 16, 1 Corinthians 16)
B. Paul counters by telling the Corinthians that his testimony among them was enough. The competent minister's reputation is widely known.
III. The competent minister has been used in a godly ministry.
A. The community was Paul's recommendation. (2 Corinthians 7:3)
B. It was a letter for every believer from Christ. (1 Corinthians 2:5)
C. The competent minister has had a transforming effect on the lives of others. (Exodus 31; 32:15-16, Jeremiah 31:33; 32:38, Ezekiel 36:26-27, Romans 13:8-10, Romans 8:4)
