B. Leadership in the church is lacking today. (Jeremiah 2:8; 5:31; 8:8; 10:21; 12:10; 23:1-2; 1 Samuel 2:10; Malachi 2; Matthew 23:15; Galatians 1; Colossians 2; 2 Peter 2)

C. Leadership is an important calling. (Acts 20; 1 Peter 5:1-2)

D. Leaders laid their hands on others to establish leadership. (Acts 14:23; Titus 1:5; Acts 13:2; 23; 20:28)

- E. There are qualifications for church leadership.
- II. The leader must be blameless.

A. This is the basic overall requirement.

B. This does not mean that he has been blameless his whole life. This refers to present blamelessness.

C. The word means that one is beyond accusation.

- D. This has to do with setting a model for others. (2 Thessalonians 3:9, 1 Peter 5)
