- X. A willingness to change and innovate.
 - A. There is nothing sacred about forms.
 - B. There is no faith without risk. An aggressive church bursts out of old forms.
 - C. There must be change or we stagnate.
 - 1. Spirit takes precedent over structure. (2 Corinthians 6:16)
 - 2. We must be open to the Spirit.
 - 3. Procedure must follow needs. (Matthew 15:1)
 - 4. There is a difference between tradition and divine command.
