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- I. Introduction.
 - A. We have more preferences than convictions too often.
 - B. A preference is...
 - 1. Based on emotion, but a conviction is based on principle.
 - 2. Oriented towards here and now, but a conviction is oriented toward the future.
 - 3. Influenced by what others think, but a conviction is influenced by what God thinks.
 - 4. Abandoned for the sake of immediate pleasure, but a conviction is seen as something with which one can obtain a reward.
 - 5. Convenience oriented, but a conviction is sacrifice oriented.
 - C. Text: Daniel 1:8, 3:16.
- II. Daniel refused to eat food sacrificed to idols—he made up his mind.
 - A. God is not looking for men He can make faithful—He is looking for men whom He can elevate.
 - B. God is looking for men and women of conviction, and He is looking to raise them to a position of influence.
- III. Shadrack, Meshack and Abednego refused to worship the idols despite the king's decree.
 - A. There is far more to lose by compromise eternally than there is gain.
 - B. The greatest tragedy of being a man of compromise is that the ultimate end in this life is destruction.
 - C. We need our children to see an illustration of one who never compromises.
 - D. Until we allow God to convict us, we miss ever being used by God.
