2. This one is pictured by the Israelite in Canaan—God takes a man out so that He might put him back in.

- B. The carnal man is the immature Christian.
 - 1. This one is pictured by the Israelites in the desert.
 - 2. They were afraid to take the land.
 - 3. The best heritage one can leave one's family is being a good person.
- C. The natural man is the unsaved man born into this world.
 - 1. He is in a state of nature.
 - 2. The natural man does not have the faculties to understand life.
- III. Habits are hard to break for the carnal Christian.
 - A. It is terrible for the Christian to end life this way.
 - B. God can take the carnal Christian in and help him.
 - C. We ought to be the kind of Christian so as not only to save our souls but also our entire lives.
