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- A. Text: Matthew 24:32.
- B. We cannot know whether Christ will return in five years or not. (Matthew 24:36)
- II. The disciples wanted to know what the signs of the end would be. (Revelation 4-19)
- III. Every generation was given the hope of Jesus' return--the time was left indefinite so that every generation would be ready. (Luke 21:34, I John 3:3)
- IV. Not even Jesus knows the time of His return. (Romans 8:28-30, Mark 13:32)
 - A. Jesus was likely suggesting that He was in submission to the will of God regarding the execution of the final plan.
 - B. The time is purposely left indefinite.
- V. The generation that saw the signs would see them all fulfilled in seven years. (Matthew 24:22-34)
- VI. The trend of events suggests that the time is near.
 - A. The development of the world religious system. (Revelation 17)
 - B. The development of a one world economic system. (Revelation 13)
 - C. The rise of the king of the north. (Ezekiel 38)
 - D. The federation of Russia with the Arab states. (Ezekiel 38, Daniel 11)
 - E. The return of Israel to the land. (Zechariah 14)
 - F. The apostasy of the church. (I-II Timothy, Titus)
