I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Romans 7:4.
- B. One of the problems a new Christian is confronting the power of sin in him.
- C. The other problem is that the expectations God lays upon them appear very difficult.
- II. The law is good, holy and spiritual. (Galatians 3)
 - A. Everyone who does not fulfill all the requirements of the law is under a curse.
 - B. While the law is good we are continually cursed when we do not fulfill every single requirement of it.
 - C. The good news is that the law has been cancelled.

III. Christ is the end of the law.

- A. We no longer have obligations towards the law.
- B. The principle of the Christian life is not self-effort. This is the flesh.
- C. We must come to the end of our own self-effort. This dies when we are in Christ.
- D. The new relationship is "marriage to Christ."
 - 1. We are to respect Jesus Christ for whom he is--the Lord.
 - 2. Marriage is lovely because two people come together out of desire.
 - 3. There is mutual availability out of love.
 - 4. The exciting thing about the Christian life is that since Jesus has risen all of his resurrection power has been made available to us.
- IV. The inevitable result of the Christian life—of Jesus releasing his life into us--is fruit.
