- B. Be careful of dependency and independence.

V. Teachable. (Acts 18:24-28)

- B. Reprove a wise man and he will love you.

VI. Committed to holiness.

- A. God is more concerned with our holiness than our happiness.
- B. We need to deal with both filthiness of the flesh and filthiness of the spirit.
(II Corinthians 6:14-7:1)
