A. Paul saw himself as a coworker.

- B. Paul had no personal ambition. (Philippians 1)
- C. We are to give ourselves to the team. (2 Timothy 4:5)

VIII. The one doing the Lord's work is sensitive to the Lord's leading in others.

A. We cannot cram people into the work of the Lord.

- B. We must be sensitive to what God is saying.
