- A. Text: John 11.
- B. Jesus' work on the cross not only frees us from the penalty of sin—It helps us with the power of sin.
- C. Lazarus's problem was that he was dead.
- D. It is possible to be dead when one is alive. This means that one is absolutely inactive with regard to spiritual activities.
- II. All that spiritually dead people need is Jesus.
 - A. Christ is all that we need.
 - B. Lazarus is a picture of defeat--Jesus is adequate to take away the defeat of sin in the Christian's life.
- III. The one who abides in Jesus ought to walk as he walked. (1 John 2:6)
 - A. Jesus walked in newness of life. (Luke 24:13, Romans 6:4)
 - B. Jesus walked in victory. (Mark 6:48-49)
 - C. Jesus walked according to God's program. (Luke 13:33)
 - D. Jesus walked for the needs of others. (John 4:4; 14; 9:4; Philippians 2:12-13; John 20:3)
- IV. "Grave clothes"
 - A. Relics of the old life. (Romans 6:5-6)
 - B. Relics of old principles. (Galatians 3:3)
 - C. Relics of old things. (2 Corinthians 5:17)
- V. Jesus—the truth—sets us free. (John 8:31, 36; 2 Corinthians 3:17, Galatians 5:1)
- VI. We are called to be dangerous not dead nor defeated.
