Scripture Memory: Helping Another Win John Crawford

- I. Introduction.
 - A. Motivation.
 - B. Everyone needs training in helping others walk spiritually, no matter how much theological education he has.
- II. Time Tested Material Beginning With Christ.
 - A. The speaker reads through Beginning With Christ and Lessons on Assurance material with the new believer.
 - 1. Salvation comes by belief and is not necessarily accompanied by feelings. (Revelation 3:20, John 1:12, 1 John 5:13)
 - 2. The new believer must first be protected from hostile enemies. Reading and memorizing the Word of God helps with this. (1 Peter 2:2, Acts 20:32, Psalm 119:11, Ephesians 6:16)
 - 3. Resort to God's Word against attacks.
 - B. Get them started memorizing the first verse: Assurance of Salvation 1 John 5:11-12.
 - C. Follow up the next week to test the new believer on his verse and add the next verse: Assurance of Answered Prayer John 16:24; continue with the rest of the memory pack. Work through all the verses and then have an exam.
 - D. While reviewing verses together, talk about anything that comes up and encourage him.
 - E. What to look for in a person before you start:
 - 1. It would be ideal for them to be saved, but get them memorizing the key verses either way.
 - 2. Start out in Scripture memory right away.
 - F. Have the student check the teacher on his verses. (Psalm 119:9, 119:18, 119:32)
- III. Going on with Christ.
 - A. The Scripture has power to guide you, keep you from temptation and give you joy. (Psalm 119:105, Jeremiah)
 - B. Start the new believer on more verses: Matthew 6:33, Philippians 4:13, Mark 5:19, John 13:34-35, 2 Corinthians 9:6-7)

- C. Review all older verses.
- D. Basic themes in discipleship: fellowship and structured checkout.
 - 1. You begin with structured checkout. (Proverbs 13:190
 - 2. As the new believer begins to grow, you move to structured checkout.
- E. Do not give the disciple everything—he has to make a commitment somewhere.

IV. Scripture memory tips.

- A. The secret to memorizing is accountability. (Isaiah 1:18-19, 2:11, 5:20-21, 8:20, 9:6, 11:3, 11:9, 14:12-14, 26:3, 28:9-10, 28:17, 30:15, 30:18, 30:21, 32:2, 32:17, 37:31, 40:25)
- B. The secret to getting over quantities of verses is knowing your verses. Start with those you know first. (Proverbs 13:9)
- C. Review out loud and with someone every opportunity you can.
