Lord of My Rocking Boat

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- I. Introduction.
 - A. We often find ourselves asking if God cares. (Mark 4)
- II. Jesus tells us that we are just as safe when the boat is rocking as we are after Jesus has calmed the storms.
- III. If we have an attitude of worry or thanklessness, we start to develop an emotional leak and water gets in our "boats."
 - A. Emotional leaks are moments when out trust in God starts to fail.
 - B. How we react to situations can cause us to develop a leak. (Hebrews 12:14)
- IV. How to deal with leaks.
 - A. Bitterness is something we must deal with. Forgiveness costs.
 - B. Sometimes we experience direct attacks of the enemy.
 - 1. We must claim the blood of Jesus.
 - 2. Sometimes we need to be made aware of a sin that is beyond our knowledge in our life that is blocking us from God's blessing. (Psalm 139:23-24)
 - C. Leaks require waiting on the Lord for a healing touch.. (Isaiah 41)
 - D. We must develop trust.
 - 1. Get to know God.
 - a. Through his Word. (Ephesians 3:14-19)
 - b. By being filled up with God by being open to the Spirit and the knowing the love of Christ. (Luke 11:35-36)
 - 2. Jesus and the Word of God are radiant. We are to be radiant to with God's reflected radiance. (Hebrews 1; Psalm 19; Ephesians 5:27)
 - 3. We pray that we might know Jesus. (Philippians 3:10)
