XV. Good Christian counselors can help with a spouse that has multiple personalities. (Isaiah 30:21)

XVI. Giving time, listening, saying you love her and many other acts can show your wife that she is number one.

XVII. Divorced and remarried people can lead as elders and deacons, but each person should follow his own conscience in light of the demands of 1 Timothy and Titus.

XVIII. God hates divorce, but someone can still find forgiveness. (1 John 1:9)

XIX. Share your feelings about your spouse taking on too many projects.

XX. Make moves to get to know the person you want to pursue.

XXI. Be patient with teenagers and set an example.

XXII. Pray out loud and ask God for help to avoid distraction during your quiet time.

XXIII. If you are concerned about your Christian growth, examine whether you are trusting him more than you were before.

XXIV. Take pain of patience away by knowing that God has your best interest at heart and that he knows what is best for you . (Jeremiah 29:11; Ephesians 1:8)

XXV. To overcome memories to enjoy the Christian marriage, zero in on your wife and do not think on the previous things. (Isaiah 43:18; Philippians 3:13)

XXVI. The problem with masturbation is what is going on in the mind. Do not feed your mind with lustful thoughts, get exercise and stay away from spicy food.

XXVII. Address masturbation with a son without laying on a guilt trip. Let him know it is a normal temptation, but address it.

XXVIII. A person should not buy respect with money. You will never know who your friends are.

XXIX. Changing the input of the mind will change the output of the life.

XXX. False prophets can be identified by saying something that does not come true.

XXXI. Use your head in making wise decisions. Do not blame God for your bad decisions. (Proverbs 30:25)

XXXII. Get out of relationships with Christians that are bad influences.

XXXIII. It is okay to borrow money to make money.

XXXIV. Accountability involves listening to a man's soul. (Isaiah 42:4)
