I. Introduction.

II. What happens when we do not trust and obey. (Numbers 13-14)

A. Our focus determines how we see things.

B. When we focus on God, we can be assured that victory is assured.

C. The negative report had a bad effect on the people. Bad attitudes infect others. (Galatians 5:9)

D. The result of their disobedience: the people were cast into the wilderness for forty years.

E. If we change our mind, we must still stay under the Lord's obedience. Some opportunities for obedience only come once. (Psalm 119:59-60)

F. We disobey because we think God doesn't want what is best for us and because we think we know what is best. (Jeremiah 29:11; Ephesians 1:8)

G. Sometimes God will stick with us until we obey. (Psalm 119:105; Exodus 33:14-15)

III. What happens when we do trust and obey. (2 Chronicles 20)

A. Jehoshaphat did not know what to do, but he knew where to look.

B. God answers those who trust him .

C. God inhabits the praise of his people. (Psalm 22:4)

IV. Application.

A. Focus on God and his promises not on the enemy and the problems.

B. Compare your giants to God and not our own puny strength.

C. Beware of who you listen to and who you follow.

D. When facing a problem:

1. Pray and write down answers to prayer.

2. Praise.

3. Wait on God.

4. Trust.

5. Obey.

6. Pray and praise.

E. Remember that there is a time element to obedience, which is now.

F. Unless God goes before you, do not go.

G. God has already won the victory.
