I. Introduction.

- A. Ministry is being at spiritual war. (Luke 4:18)
- B. War is declared in heaven, which is a reflection of what is going on today. (Isaiah 14:12)
- II. Satan wanted to be like God.
 - A. The problem was not with what he said—we all strive to be like God.
 - B. Satan's grasp for power was the problem. It was an issue of motive.
 - C. We are tempted towards what is low and base and towards what is right with the wrong motive. (Romans 5:12)
 - D. Christ reconciled us while we were enemies with God. (Colossians 1)
- III. We are in a spiritual battle today. (Ephesians 6)
 - A. We are to be sober in this battle.
 - B. We are to resist the devil. (James 4:7, Ephesians 4:27)
 - C. Satan targets God's person, grace and Word.
- IV. Resisting the enemy.
 - A. We must rely on the spiritual blessings provided for us in the heavenly places. (Ephesians 1:3)
 - B. All the resources of God are at our disposal. (Ephesians 1:19)
 - C. We have been seated with Christ at the right hand of the Father. (Ephesians 2:6)
 - D. We have been given power in terms of authority. We appropriate the authority of Jesus by faith. (Luke 10:18-19, Daniel 10)
 - E. We have a reputation with the devil. (Acts 19)
 - F. There are no spiritual shortcuts—we need to have fellowship with Christ daily.

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- A. Do not forget who you are and where God has placed you. (Ephesians 2:6)
- B. Do not get entangled in the affairs of the world. (II Timothy 2:3-4, Hebrews 12:1-2)
- C. Claim the power of the blood of Christ in thwarting the power of Satan. (Revelation 12:11)
