- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Ephesians 5:22-23.
 - B. Having a fulfilling marriage is elusive today.
- II. Marriage is difficult. (Genesis 2:18-25; 1:27)
 - A. There was perfect unity in creation between man and women.
 - B. There was a co-regency even though there were different rules.
 - C. God's design for marriage was for procreation, elimination of solitude (Genesis 2:8), physical fulfillment (1 Corinthians 7) and for joy (1 Corinthians 13, Genesis 26:6-9).
 - D. The most basic things became cursed after the fall. (Genesis 3:5, Romans 5)
 - E. There are problems in marriage because there is a curse on marriage itself.
 - F. It is natural to be selfish, and this makes marriage difficult.
 - G. Satan attacks man at his most basic need.
 - H. Society is confusing this meaningful relationship. It puts forward a fantasy.
- III. Without Christ and being filled with the Spirit one can never have a fulfilling marriage.
- IV. The duty of the husband.
 - A. He is to love his wives.
 - B. He is also to submit under mutual submission.
 - C. Society celebrates the macho man, but this is depraved.
- V. The manner husbands are to love their wives is how Christ loved the church.
 - A. Christ loves the church in that he gave when people were unworthy to receive. (Romans 5:8)
 - B. Genuine love is an act of the will. This kind of love is irresistible.
 - C. Husbands must be understanding and sensitive.
 - D. Husbands should be chivalrous.
 - E. Husbands must have communion with their wives—their spiritual lives should be shared together.
