 - B. This passage contains Paul's perspective on serving the Lord.
 - C. The way to do the work of the Lord is to do as much as possible. (Ephesians 1:8, Philippians 1:9, I Thessalonians 3:12, 4:1, 4:10, II Corinthians 8)
 - D. There are several principles to doing the work of the Lord. (Philippians 2:25)
- II. If one is going to do as much as possible, he must begin with liberal giving. (II Corinthians 8)
 - A. We give as God has prospered.
 - B. There was no percentage of giving demanded in the Bible. There was a basic tax structure in the Old Testament, but believers were called to give more. (Deuteronomy 14, 12)
 - C. Giving is to be sacrificial.
 - D. Giving is an investment. (Galatians 6, II Corinthians 9)
- III. There must be a vision for the future.
- IV. There must be a sense of flexibility. (Acts 16)
- V. There must be a commitment to thoroughness and excellence. (Galatians 4)
- VI. There must be a commitment to present service.
- VII. One must accept opposition as a challenge.
- VIII. Believers must function as a team. (Acts 19:22)
- IX. There must be sensitivity to the work of the Spirit in others.
