I. Introduction.

A. Text: Daniel 9:20-27.

B. Jesus has many titles in the Old Testament. (Psalm 2:2, Zechariah 3:8, Joshua 5:4, Isaiah 9:6, Haggai 2:7, Isaiah 28:16, Zachariah 13:1, Isaiah 6:1, Psalm 48:14, Isaiah 41:14, Psalm 18, Isaiah 26:4, Micah 5:1, Isaiah 33:22, Daniel 9, Malachi 3:3, Isaiah 60:16, 25:4, Jeremiah 23:6, Deuteronomy 32:15, Isaiah 11:1, Genesis 3:15, Isaiah 42, Malachi 4:2)

C. He is also called the King and Prince.

II. The circumstances of Daniel.

A. Daniel was in prayer.

B. This was not uncommon for Daniel.

C. He was set towards glorifying God in prayer.

D. The arrival of the angel Gabriel—God quickly moved to action for Daniel.

III. God's message about the coming period of time.

A. God will bring sin under divine control.

B. God will make an end of sins in specific.

C. God will make reconciliation by covering iniquity.
