A. People demanded some kind of training from Jesus.

B. They could not believe that Jesus was from God because he was too common.

C. They were offended at Jesus by his background, commonness and what he taught. (Isaiah 8, 1 Corinthians 1:28)

D. The people would not believe because they were not ready to give up their sin.

- V. Unbelief blocks the supernatural.
  - A. Unbelief always stops miracles and the supernatural. (Luke 17, Matthew 12)

B. Those who are willfully hard hearted will not receive a miracle from God. (John 9)

C. Nothing happens when unbelief seeks a miracle. (Hebrews 3:12)
