The Church that Christ Builds, Part 1 John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Matthew 16:18-20.
- B. There is a distinction between building the church and having a church that Christ is building.
- C. In spite of what appears on the surface, Jesus affirms to his disciples that he is building his church.
 - 1. There have always been times where it appeared that God's people were wiped out.
 - 2. This gives great hope that there will be victory in the end.
- D. There are certain characteristics of Christ's church.

II. It is certain.

- A. This is so since Jesus is building it.
- B. All we are called to do is to be in the place where Christ is building by taking on the right attitudes.
- C. The Lord is the one who builds the church, not people. (John 6, Acts 2:47, 5:14, 11:24, 13:48, 18:10, Ephesians 5)
- D. The Lord is building the church to present it to himself for his glory. (Ephesians 3:21)

III. Intimacy.

- A. We are Christ's personal possession. (Acts 20:28)
- B. We are joined to him in one spirit. (1 Corinthians 6, John 10)

IV. Identity.

- A. "Church" was a very general term for those assembled. (Acts 7, 19:32, Hebrews 12:22)
- B. Jesus is saying that he is continuing to build his redeemed people/his kingdom.
- C. The emphasis is on his continued building of the redeemed community.

1. Why is it important to recognize that men do not build Christ's church?
2. What does it look like to partake in the building effort of Christ?
3. How is Christ's desire to have a personal relationship with his followers reflected in his building effort?
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
