 - 3. The ministry of the people. (Matthew 18)
- D. Preaching on the holiness of God and the sinfulness of sin was the power of the Great awakening.
- E. A movement away from teaching the holiness of God emasculates the church and hurts evangelism.
- F. True revival is people being broken spiritually. The mortification of sin is essential.
