C. We are to forgive like children. (Ephesians 4:32, Matthew 6)

II. If a Christian does not forgive others, God will chasten him. (Hebrews 12:34)

A. The kingdom of heaven is the sphere of God's rule on earth through grace and salvation.

B. God will take account, which is a temporal accounting. God calls men to give an account for their lives periodically. (Romans 1, John 16, Romans 7, Exodus 38:24, Daniel 7:10)

C. A person comes to the accounting time of God so that he can see the exceeding sinfulness of sin. This is a critical element to salvation. (Romans 7:13)

D. We receive God's forgiveness when we are broken over our sin.
