- A. Text: Matthew 19:23-29.
- B. Out of the episode where the rich man asks Jesus about Jesus comes some profound principles about riches.
- C. Jesus often taught that it is difficult for the rich to come to salvation. (Matthew 10:38)
- II. Jesus taught that it is impossible for rich people to be saved.
 - A. It is impossible to be saved when one comes on his or her own human terms. (Matthew 11:12)
 - B. Jesus discredits all works righteousness systems. (Mark 10:24, Jeremiah 13:24)
 - C. Man cannot be saved by himself.
 - D. This impossibility is crystallized in rich people.
 - 1. They have a false security. They tend to feel complacent. (1 Timothy 6:17)
 - 2. They are bound to this world. (1 Timothy 6:6, Mark 4)
 - 3. They are selfish. (Luke 16)
- III. Salvation is not by the will of man, it is by the will of God. (John 1:13, 2 Timothy 2:24)
- IV. Peter sees salvation as abandoning everything and following Christ.
- V. There will be great reward for those who have given everything for Christ. (1 Peter 2)
 - A. They will rule.
 - B. They will receive more than they gave up.
 - C. They will inherit eternal life. (Romans 8, 1 Corinthians 15, Ephesians 2)
