## Signs of Christ's Coming, Part 7 John MacArthur

## I. Introduction.

- A. It is easy to take for granted the privilege of learning God's Word.
- B. Text: Matthew 24:32-35.
- C. The hope of every Christian is the Second Coming of Jesus Christ and our final redemption.
- D. In response to questions about signs of Jesus' Coming, he talks about Antichrist and the earth being shaken. Jesus then addresses questions about the timing of his coming.

## II. An uncomplicated analogy.

- A. Parables were meant to make things clear. (Matthew 13)
- B. Parables illustrate simple truths.
- C. The parable of the fig tree.
  - 1. The fig tree was a common teaching aide. (Hosea 9:10, Jeremiah 24, Joel 1:26-27)
  - 2. When a fig tree buds its springs, the harvest season is near. (Philippians 4:11)
  - 3. God is going to judge the world, and time is moving toward that point. (Matthew 13)
  - 4. The season that is near is the kingdom of God. (Luke 21:31, Revelation 20)
- III. "This generation" will not pass away until these things have come to pass.
  - A. "This generation" refers to the generation that will experience the signs of the end.
  - B. This cannot be the church because the church will be raptured. (1 Thessalonians 4, Revelation 1:7, John 14:3, Romans 11)
  - C. This generation refers to the people who were not raptured, both unredeemed and Jews who will be redeemed.
- IV. Heaven and earth as we know it will pass away. In its place will come a new creation. (2 Peter 3:10, John 10:35)
