- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Matthew 25:
 - B. The message of judgment is all over the Bible. (Psalm 15; 1:5)
 - 1. The Old Testament has to do with temporal judgment.
 - 2. The New Testament has to do with eternal judgment primarily.
 - C. Love warns
- II. When the second coming occurs, judgment will take place immediately.
- III. The judgment will occur through the separation of the redeemed and the unredeemed.
 - A. The righteous are put on the right hand.
 - B. The source of their salvation is sovereign grace. They are born into the family of God by faith. (Romans 8)
 - C. Their salvation is select. (1 Peter 1:3)
- IV. The mark of salvation is always manifest righteousness, particularly love.
 - A. The righteous met the needs of Jesus.
 - B. Whatever we do to meet the needs of believers, we do to Jesus. (1 Corinthians 6:17; Galatians 2:20; Matthew 15; 10:40)
 - C. The monumental successes do not prove salvation--it is the day to day routine acts of love. (Romans 2, 2 Peter 1, 1 John 3:15-16)
 - D. Christ identifies with the least of the believers. The "least" need the most help.
 - E. People are judged by what they do not do. People do not believe in Jesus Christ resulting in their judgment. (Zechariah 14:9)
