## The Last Passover, Part 2 John MacArthur

- I. Introduction.
  - A. Text: Matthew 26.
- II. The sharing of the Passover meal.
  - A. They cleaned their hands in order to symbolize the need for salvation.
  - B. They started arguing at this point over who was the greatest. (Luke 22:24, John 13)
    - 1. Jesus rebukes them for their pride.
    - 2. The disciples are well rebuked by the time the meal arrives.
- III. The shocking of the Twelve.
  - A. Jesus announces that one of the people eating with him (a friend) would turn him over. (Psalm 55, John 13:22, Luke 22:23, Psalm 41:9, Luke 22:21)
  - B. Jesus' death was in the plan of God, but Judas is still responsible. (Psalm 22, Isaiah 53, Hebrews 10, John 13:27)
  - C. Judas was dismissed because he was to have no part in the Passover meal.
- IV. The Passover Jesus celebrated was the last divinely sanctioned Passover. He celebrated it in order to bring it to an end.
- V. All took the bread. All believers partake in the blood and body of Christ.
  - A. The bread is emblematic of Christ's body given in death for believers. (1 Corinthians 11)
  - B. The blood represents Jesus death for sins.
    - 1. There had to be bloodshed for a sacrifice to occur.
    - 2. Jesus' death was for our forgiveness. (Matthew 24-25)
  - C. The Supper was to be celebrated until Jesus returned.
  - D. Jesus emphasizes that he will come again to enjoy the meal with them.
