Israel's Future, Part 3 John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: Daniel 9.
- B. Israel is still a part of God's plan. (1 Samuel 12:22; Psalm 89:31-37; 94; Romans 11:1)
- C. Daniel prays that Israel would be restored, and God moved. (Isaiah 65:24)

II. The person of God.

- A. Sin would be dealt with, and Israel would be restored.
- B. God planned 490 years until Christ would return.
 - 1. It would begin with the decree to rebuild Jerusalem. (Nehemiah 1-2)
 - 2. It would end with the Triumphal entry of Jesus Christ.
- C. There is a gap between the seventieth week, which is common in prophecy.
- D. Messiah would be killed before the last "week."
 - 1. The cross was a stumbling block.
 - 2. Even the disciples could not handle this.
 - 3. This happened exactly as Daniel said it would.
 - 4. It is tragic that the Jews did not recognize this. (Psalm 22, Isaiah 53)
- III. The antichrist would be revived with the return of Antichrist.
 - A. There would be a holocaust beyond any holocausts.
 - B. The destruction of Jerusalem matches this pattern.
 - C. There are many gaps in Scripture. (1 Peter 1:11; Luke 4)
 - D. There will be an abomination in the middle of the seven week tribulation. Antiochus Epiphanes previews this.
 - E. The Antichrist makes himself an idol. (2 Thessalonians 2)
 - F. The Antichrist will be destroyed at the end of the seventh week.
