- III. A warning about self-deception.
 - A. Empty words.
 - B. Empty hearts.
 - C. Self deceived people can be spotted by those who are seeking the self indulgent byproducts of the faith more than God himself.
 - D. Self deceived people are more committed to their group or class than God or the Bible.
 - E. Self deceived people are content to stay in unbiblical organizations. .
 - F. Self deceived people often treat the bible only as an academic concern.
 - G. Self deceived people are those who over emphasize one doctrine.
 - H. Self deceived people do not have grace.
- IV. The characteristic of the true believer is that he is a doer and not a hearer only.

- A. Verbal profession is right but not by itself. (Romans 10)
- B. The mark of empty words is that there is nothing to verify it except a life of sin. Profession without possession is the ultimate profanity.
- C. There is folly in empty words.
 - 1. The man who gives words only looks a lot like the Christian.
 - 2. His foundation is only revealed at the storm, which is likely God's judgment.
 - 3. It is tough to build a good foundation, but we must work hard to do it in people. (Luke 6:46)
