I. Introduction.

- A. Text: John 8:21-30.
- B. Every man who has ever lived is responsible for some degree of the light--man has conscience and creation. (Romans 1)
- C. Man does not live up to the light, however. (John 3)
- D. There are four attitudes that guarantee one will die in his or her sin.

II. Self-righteousness. (John 7:36)

- A. The Jews accused Jesus of going to hell.
- B. They were so self-righteous that they did not think that they had a sin problem and needed a savior.
- C. The Jews have developed a system of human achievement. (Luke 15:16)
- D. One's heavenly citizenship is already had or not had. (1 John 5:19)

III. Worldliness.

- A. The "world" refers to the spiritual system of evil. (Matthew 13:22)
- B. People born into the world are a part of this system. (Luke 16:8, Galatians 4:1)
- C. The Christian has died to this system.

IV. Beyond belief.

- A. Salvation is available for those who believe.
- B. Wrath remains on the one who does not trust Christ. (John 3:36)

V. Willful ignorance.

- A. Jesus was clear who he was.
- B. The people willfully rejected Jesus.
- C. The cross would be the point where these Jews would know.
