- B. Struggling (temptation). (Romans 7:14)
 - 1. Believers are transformed when they receive Christ. (Galatians 2:20, Romans 6)
 - 2. The old person has been crucified. The old "I" died, and the new "I" was born.
 - 3. The old law in one's flesh wars against the new law.
 - 4. The new man struggles with the sin that is still there in the Christian life.
 - 5. Struggling works for good because...
 - a. It leads us to prayer. (Psalm 42)
 - b. It devastates our spiritual pride. (2 Corinthians 12)
 - c. It teaches us lessons to help others. (Ephesians 6)
 - d. It teaches us to lean on Christ.
 - e. It makes you desire heaven. (Philippians 3:21)

C. Sin.
1. God brings light out of darkness.
2. Sin is evil, but God overrules it.
3. God keeps cleansing it. (1 John 1)
4. Sin can teach us humility.
5. Sin can lead us to forgiveness, which leads us to praise.
