A. He chose those who are saved before the world was ever created. (Matthew 25:34, Luke 12:32, John 6:44, 15:16, Acts 9:15, 13:48, II Thessalonians 2:18, II Timothy 1:9, Revelation 17:8)

B. He previously determined our destiny to be children of God. (Galatians 3:26, 4:6, I John 3:1, Isaiah 46:10)

C. He "graced" us, which was giving us something we did not deserve. (Ephesians 2, Acts 15:11, 18:27, Romans 3:24, Romans 5)

D. He redeemed us through the blood of Christ. (Revelation 5)

E. He forgave us. (Matthew 26:28, Ephesians 4:32, Colossians 2:13, I John 2:12, Matthew 18)

F. He enlightened us. God gave us His Spirit so we might know the mind of Christ. (I Corinthians 2:12)

G. He gave us an inheritance. (Romans 8:17, 1 John 3:2, II Corinthians 1:22)

I. We are God's own possession sealed for the day of redemption.

VI. Our response to the work of God (that is even generated by God) is to hope in Christ and believe in the gospel. It is all a gift. We deserve no praise for our salvation.
