- I. Introduction.
 - A. Text: Ephesians 4:11-16.
 - B. There is tremendous emphasis on church growth. The pattern for the progress of the church is in this text.
 - C. The goal of the church is for the perfection of the saints.
- II. The preaching of perfection: the gifted men are charged with building up the saints.
 - A. Agencies of perfection.
 - 1. The Word. The goal of teaching the Bible is perfection. (Colossians 1:28)
 - 2. Prayer. (Colossians 4)
 - 3. Suffering.
 - B. Teaching the Word is a tremendous commitment. (1 Timothy 6:4; 4:13; 2 Timothy 2:2)
- III. The progress of perfection: the saints are to do the work of the ministry. (2 Peter 1:12)
 - A. When saints are mature, the ministry is really going.
 - B. Saints ought to develop a ministry, and when their ministry has developed to the point where it needs support then it should be supported.
- IV. The purpose of perfection: the body is edified.
 - A. Unity of the faith. We must agree about Christ before we can agree in Christ.
 - B. Knowledge of the Son of God. (Philippians 3)
 - C. The whole church will come to be like Christ. (1 John 2:6, 2 Corinthians 3:18)
 - D. Doctrinal solidarity. (Ephesians 6:11)
 - E. The truth will be spoken in love: evangelism.
