I. Introduction.
A. Text: Philippians 2:5-8.
B. The text of this passage was a Christological hymn.
C. Unity in the church comes out of humility.
D. Christ is the model for humility.
E. Christ is a model in everything. (I John 2:6, I Corinthians 11:1, I Thessalonians 1:6, Romans 15:2, Matthew 11:29, John 13, I Chronicles 6-8)
II. Our humiliation begins with relinquishing our right to status.
A. Christ existed in the form of God.
B. This means before the Incarnation, He existed as fully God.
C. The loftiness of one's calling is not something to be held onto.
III. We must empty ourselves.
A. The attitude of not holding on to things leads to the actions of emptying oneself.
B. Jesus gave up His glory, His independent authority, the exercise of His divine attributes, His eternal riches and His favorable relationship with God. (John 17, Hebrews 5:8, John 5:30, Matthew 24:36, II Corinthians 8:9, 5:21)
C. Humility is willing to stoop in the face of the needs of others.
D. Jesus took the form of a bondservant and carried the burden of our sins. (Matthew 28:27, Isaiah 53:6)
E. Jesus became made in the likeness of man yet without sin. (Hebrews 4:13)
F. He took on the appearance of man.
G. Jesus humbled Himself to the point of death, which is the epitome of death. This was the way that men had to be served.
