I. Introduction.

- A. Text: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-2.
- B. The Thessalonian church was a church that brought Paul joy.
- C. Paul is encouraged that the Thessalonians are truly the elect. (Deuteronomy 7:7-8, Matthew 24, Luke 18:7, Romans 8:33, Colossians 3:12, 2 Timothy 2:10)
- D. We are Christians because of God's loving choice. (John 15; 17:9; Acts 13:46)
- E. Belief is a result of sovereign choice. (Romans 9, 1 Corinthians 1:9, 2 Thessalonians 2:13, 2 Timothy 1:9, Revelation 13)
- F. Some churches do not reflect the positive report that the Thessalonians did. (Revelation 2, Matthew 13)
- G. The Thessalonians showed many signs of the elect.
- II. Background on Thessalonica. (Acts 17:6)
 - A. It was a thriving sea port that became famous for vice.
 - B. It was a wicked city. Murder and abortion was common.
 - C. Paul evangelized the city for three Sabbaths in the synagogue, but he worked there longer.
 - (1 Thessalonians 2:9)
 - D. The Jews became jealous and caused an uproar.
 - E. Timothy's report causes Paul to send the letter.
- III. Paul and the Thessalonians shared a vital union to Christ--they were "in Christ."
- IV. Paul wishes more grace and peace for the church beyond the beginning of salvation.
 - A. We have grace for our sin.
 - B. We have peace for our guilt.
- V. Paul gives thanks for the church in his prayers because they were elect.

2. What courage can we take for evangelism in knowing the kind of culture Paul had to deal with in witnessing to the Thessalonians?
