A Pastoral Prayer: 1 Thessalonians 3:11-13 John MacArthur

I. Introduction.

- A. Text: 1 Thessalonians 3.
- B. The true pastor prays for his people.
- C. Paul give the pastor a model of what he should pray for his people.
- D. Spiritual growth is always a goal of prayer: faith, love and hope. (1 Corinthians 3)
- E. God and Jesus are jointly addressed putting them on an equal level. Paul uses a singular pronoun for both showing that they are one.

II. A perfecting faith.

- A. Paul prays that God would thwart Satan.
- B. Satan is never addressed directly. The Lord deals with Satan.
- C. Faith is the ability to trust the truth.
 - 1. One must know the truth to trust it.
 - 2. Bringing faith to perfection is not a mystical thing.
 - 3. Faith is perfected by expanding comprehension of the truth.
- D. The more we trust truth, the more we obey it. (1 Peter 2)
- E. Old Testament truths.
 - 1. God punishes sin, blesses righteousness and is gracious.
 - 2. There must be a sacrifice for sin.
- F. How we know our faith is growing.
 - 1. Our knowledge of the Word is growing.
 - 2. Our confidence in God is greater.
 - 3. Our trust in God's sovereignty is greater.
 - 4. There is greater obedience.

5. There is joy in trials.

III. A posturing love.

- A. It is an increasing kind of love.
- B. God teaches us love. (John 4:9)
- C. Paul is constantly praying for the spiritual growth of the church, and a major dimension of it was increased love. (Philippians 1:9, Romans 1:11)
- D. Love is the evidence of growing faith.
- E. We are to love all--even our enemies. (Matthew 5, John 13:34-35)
- F. The only way to love like this is through truth.

IV. A purifying hope.

- A. This means to make one immovable against temptation.
- B. Selfless love is the opposite of selfish lust. We ought to love God and others fully so as not to crave the world.
- C. Purifying has as its goal blamelessness.
 - 1. We are to be pure before God. (Leviticus 19)
 - 2. We will face God at the coming of Jesus where we will be judged. (1 John 3, 2 Corinthians 5)
