What if a Man isn't Saved? J. Dwight Pentecost

I. Introduction.

- A. The only things that are sure are death and judgment after death. (Hebrews 9:27)
- B. Death is the greatest enemy of death because of the certainty of judgment that will follow.
- C. Man was placed in a sin free environment and was created to have fellowship with God. (Genesis 2:16-17)
- D. Death from sin resulted in separation from God and separation of the soul from the body.
- E. Adam was a sinner, so death began to work itself into his body as a result.
- F. Text: John 5.
- II. Jesus possessed all the authority to give life and to judge that the Father possessed. (Romans 6:23, Revelation 20:11-15)
- III. When Adam sinned, he brought spiritual death into the world. Consequently, every person is born in sin and death. The second death confirms the first physical one.
- IV. The first death may be reversed by the infusion of spiritual life. This is what Jesus came to do. (Genesis 3:21)
 - A. God provided Adam and Eve with a covering in their nakedness.
 - B. God had to sacrifice an animal to do this. This was a picture of the price that God had to pay for the sin of Adam and Eve. God provided atonement for them.
 - C. Without the shedding of blood there is no remission of sin.
 - D. Being made alive is union of the soul to God.
- V. Jesus Christ is a judge, but this only falls on those who are dead and separated from God. (John 5:24)
- VI. The only way to receive life is to receive the free gift of salvation through Jesus Christ. One might be made alive through trusting Jesus.
